 - Switching to Principal for dental insurance providing \$4421 in annual savings to the school and \$7/month savings on family premiums.
 - Staying with Medica for the health coverage we presently have, representing a 15% increase in premium with the school bearing the entire increase (\$149,593 annually). In addition, offering voluntary participation in Healthiest You, an app for virtual visits to various health professionals, including mental health, which provides opportunities for convenience and cost saving.



LEA Enrollment as of November 1 = 1115 total K-8 students with open enrollment underway


